On January 7, 1957, Reverend Herbert Stroman began to make Pastoral history as he became the Pastor of Christian Hope Baptist Church. The only church that he ever pastured, he served dutifully and faithfully as the Pastor for fifty-six years. Seeking to enhance his biblical knowledge, he completed Theological studies at Union Baptist Bible College and Seminary in Houston, Texas as well as Bishop Theological College in Dallas, Texas. Pastor Herbert Stroman was loved, admired and respected as a man of God. He was a powerful proclaimer of the Gospel. He not only touched lives in Texas, but throughout the United States. Under his leadership, thirty-four ministers have been licensed and six active pastors serve under the auspices of his pastoral care. Pastor Stroman was a visionary leader that remained steadfast, unmovable and always abounding in the word of God.

Pastor Herbert Stroman loved God, family and church. He was known throughout the community. Whenever called upon to preach, pray for the sick or feed the hungry, he was always available to lend his assistance.
