Due to the shockingly dismal turnout of 13% for the recent November General Election held on Nov. 8th for the Mayoral and various other City Council, HISD and HCC races, political pundits unfortunately expect an even less turnout for the scheduled Runoff Election on Saturday, Dec. 10 th.

There are 4 city council seats up for grabs and are scheduled for the Runoff Election including City Council At-Large Position 2

which had a packed race of 10 candidates vying for the seat. Well known business owner and pastor,

Andrew C. Burks, Jr.,

garnered 17.4% of the votes which positioned him as the *frontrunner*

, and 15.7% for his opponent, Kristi Thibaut. Burks has run for city council four times previously, and in 2009, he was in another runoff with the incumbent Sue Lovell who is term limited.

Burks is a native Houstonian who has been a trailblazer in the telecommunications industry as the first African American to own a telephone communications/interconnect company in the city. He has installed and managed telephone systems for many businesses and residences throughout the city. He's often reluctant to acknowledge that he successfully opened doors for many other minorities who followed in his footsteps.

His ongoing commitment to his community primarily stems from having been taught by his parents at an early age the need to make a difference in peoples' lives. He began his community involvement at the young age of 5 when he eagerly began participating in activities at both the South Central YMCA and the Red Shield Boys Club. NAACP as a youth participant and was also a well-rounded athlete in high school having participated in football, baseball and swimming programs at Jack Yates High School.

Burks is a lifelong Democrat who has been committed and actively involved with democratic politics for many years.
