Robert Griffin III-QB Washington Redskins: The Heisman Trophy winner enters the nation's capital with lofty expectations. He even won his first-preseason game last week against the Buffalo Bills. With a big arm and running ability, Griffin should get off to a good start in Mike Shanahan's offense.

Andrew Luck-QB Indianapolis Colts: Luck made it look easy in his preseason opening win over the weekend. He will look to be the third consecutive No. 1 pick and quarterback to win the top rookie honors. He is certainly ready to take over an NFL team, and there shouldn't be much of a learning curve. Mark Barron-S Tampa Bay Buccaneers: Barron, a teammate of Richardson at the University of Alabama, dominates the Defensive Rookie of the Year category. Play-making safeties have done well as rookies in the NFL, so Barron should star right away for the Bucs and be very successful.

Morris Claiborne-CB Dallas Cowboys: The Cowboys traded up to get the draft's best cover man, and like Patrick Peterson a year ago, Claiborne could improve his resume by returning kickoffs. He has the potential to be great and should thrive in coordinator Rob Ryan's defensive scheme.

Michael Floyd-WR Arizona Cardinals: Floyd, considered to be the draft's top receiver, will line up opposite Larry Fitzgerald. The physical Floyd should have an opportunity to put up quality numbers. A lot depends on the quarterback situation in Arizona, but Floyd will get his chances
